

PROCESSES

To achieve ultimate goal of Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in Development twin track approach is followed by AATAPI:

- 1. Sensitization and Awareness of Communities towards Persons with disabilities and their inclusion
- 2. Empowering of Persons with Disabilities to create space for themselves in development arena

Empowerment process is intense with a shift envisaged from victim mode to Rights holder mode. It is cyclic and dynamic process where AATAPI enganged at SWA-SAMUHA-SAMUDAY






level with PwDs to take their legitimate space in development of self, persons with disabilities as community and overall contribution in development of their village and community at large.

Largely AATAPI follows principle of Inclusion and therefore Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) with in-depth needs assessment at individual level to multi pronged approach in addressing that at collective level. CBR encompasses need based interventions on following aspects :



AATAPI's interventions has evolved around this matrix and at one level it converges in community based processes, inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in development process.

The process is steered by Leadership cultivated consciously to lead the processes at all three levels of swa, samuha and samuday.





MILESTONES

Broadly the program has evolved in its organic nature and has been instrumental in expansion of AATAPI in 45 villages will now .Following are the broad Milestones of evolution of the program in the span of ten years. This has in itself given a theory of change to AATAPI for better and effective programming for PwDs.

IMPACTS



- 1. *Maximum coverage* of Persons with Disabilities from Jambusar block in accessing Rights and Entitlements in Bharuch district
- Leadership amongst PwDs has emerged in 50 plus villages that supports at local level Core Leadership of 20 PwDs including 5 women, Primary level leadership of 40 leaders at village level.
- 3. Collective advocacy with State Trasport Department on usage of Bus Pass in all buses of ST led to Government Resolution which mandates bus travel as entitled in all types of buses including Volvo.
- 4. Viklang Parivartan Sangathan a non registered organization has created space for itself at state level advocacy processes In the *first Open Court of Gujarat* on Rights of Persons with Disabilities, maximum applications (15) were registered from Jambusar block as well as maximum participation on the day of open court was from Jambusar block under the leadership of Viklang Parivartan Sangathan
- 5. Parents of Children and adolescent with special need are now seeking options for rehabilitation of their children, long term support systems, active group of 20 parents of children with special needs is part of VPS.
- 6. *Models of Correctional surgery* in children has created faith, awareness about resources amongst parents of children with special needs
- Need based fund raising by sensitization of Corporate correctional surgeries (SFCT) and health interventions (Barbeque Nations) as well as individual donors – crowd funding for Livelihood of Women with Disabilities




- 8. Early identification and prevention of Disability understood by ASHA workers and Anganwadi workers associated with AATAPI as critical for curbing disabilities.
- 9. Accessibility of infrastructure is now accepted as an important aspect of empowering
- 10. **Community based organizations** initiated by AATAPI Ujaas Mahila Bachat Dhiran Grahak Sahakari Mandali and Vivekanand Khedut Mandali are **sensitized** towards Persons with Disabilities, **aware** about their rights and entitlements and are emerging as larger support system for PwDs in villages

With AATAPI's guidance she took all opportunities of learning that came to her. In one of the exposure trip to Ahmedabad, she was inspired to learn tailoring for livelihood and she took several trainings. Today she is earning well and actively contributes to Viklang Parivartan Sangathan and SHG as well.

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WAY FORWARD

AATAPI has created a space for itself as organization rooting for cause of Persons with Disabilities at various levels. AATAPI engaged with district administration and Hon. Collector and under the aegis of district collector office Garima Initiative for Livelihood is taking shape.

An integrated community based inclusive model for development of persons with disabilities is emerging out of this which clarifies role of development organization while engaging with persons with disabilities and empowering them.

This engagement with PwDs and their inclusion in development processes has enhanced belief, an understanding and commitment of AATAPI towards inclusive environment where PwDs do not have to raise a slogan – "Nothing about us, without Us"
